Min 213 / January / 22 – Reports

1. Jubilee Report

The jubilee committee reported that they were unanimous in the following recommendations to Council :-

- Mugs for pupils of Ysgol Gynradd Llandeilo and Ysgol Gymraeg Teilo Sant = £1602
- A commemorative tree, native lime recommended, 15m high = £889
Overall cost to include digging hole and plaque
- Party in Penlan Park, Cost = £500-£900 (includes toilets and generator)
- A separate suggestion was flags and bunting

After a broad discussion, it was decided each item would be voted on separately, as follows.

A) Cllr Gordon Kilby proposed that the jubilee group speak with each Headteachers of the primary schools to discuss the proposal of the gift of Mugs. Seconded Cllr Edward Thomas.
5 voted for.
4 voted against.
Vote carried

B) Mayor Rob Jones then proposed, if both Head teachers agree to mugs for each pupil, then council would definitely provide the mugs. Seconded Cllr Lesley Prosser.
5 voted for.
3 voted against.
2 abstentions.
Vote passed.

C) A vote was taken on purchasing a commemorative tree:-
5 votes for
4 Votes against
1 Abstention

D) Regarding the Party in the Park, it was advised the Clerk contact other local groups who may want to get involved. Clerk to report back to the jubilee group.

E) Flagpole costings had been circulated. It was proposed that all be purchased to replace existing ones which have deteriorated in the weather. Proposed by Cllr Edward Thomas, Seconded by Cllr Colin Jenkins.

F) Regarding purchasing Flags, Cllr Eifion Davies proposed the purchase of 18 Union Jacks and 18 Welsh Flags. Cllr Geraint Price counter proposed the purchase of 18 Union flag with jubilee inserts and 18 Welsh flags.

Counterproposal was passed with 5 votes
3 votes for the original proposal
2 abstention

A final vote was taken to purchase bunting, proposed by Cllr Charlotte Walker, Seconded by Cllr Geraint Price. No votes in favour, not carried.

Cllr Geraint Price will be providing the cash prizes for the jubilee window display competition.
